The Shimbun publishes on June 15 and December 15. Submissions are due by June 1 and December 1. Late articles may be held until the next edition. # From the Desk of the Editor

The Shimbun is a vital tool for connecting the member schools of the Kyokai and is the only known non-parochial newsletter about our karate style with a worldwide and multi-school audience.

Whenever you bring new people on-board you get new ideas and I am no exception. Let me share my vision, and some of the changes we're making to improve the Shimbun.

I envision the Shimbun not only as the Kyokai's primary publication – please don't call it a rag :) - but also as an opportunity for the entire Shorinjiryu community to move closer together. Shinan Kori Hisataka's Shorinjiryu has many valuable flavors and all have things to offer. To support this, we will now accept Shorinjiryu related articles from any Shorinjiryu school or practitioner, regardless of political affiliation.

To insure the highest quality content, we are setting up an Editorial Board to review all submissions. Consisting of senior individuals from three schools, the Board will ensure that each article receives a multi-school review.

Opening the Shimbun to the wider community requires that we communicate guidelines for publication. Our guidelines are very simple: a) you cannot advocate any school or style as better than another, b) you cannot market products or services, c) your article must be in alignment with the Kyokai principle of non-interference between member schools, d) and your article must be in English. We reserve the right to make minor grammar and spelling corrections, and of course will have to reformat it to the Shimbun's format.

You may submit articles or pictures either to Hanshi Myron or myself at the addresses above. You may submit them anytime, but sooner is better than later. We intend to publish the Shimbun twice yearly, on June 15 and December 15. The submission deadlines to guarantee inclusion in the current issue are June 1 and December 1, respectively. Submissions may be in Word, Open Office, or text format. Please do not send Adobe pdf formatted files. Please send the original pictures separate from the article so I can size them for email publication.
